

- THE SUITE HEARD IN THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE was written in 1945 by Eric DeLamarter (1880–1953), Organist and Director of Music at Fourth Presbyterian Church from 1914 until 1935. A prolific composer, he was also a music critic in Chicago and Assistant Conductor of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.
