
Each third Sunday of May we mark **Dedication Commemoration Sunday**, remembering the dedication of our Michigan Avenue sanctuary in May 1914. This year our observance will pair with "**Leave a Legacy Sunday**." During Coffee Hour on Sunday, May 19 we will have information available about how to remember the church in your will or as a beneficiary in your life insurance.
