

News and Opportunities

We are glad to have you with us today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Church! * Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. * We invite you to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice.



The new "Big Questions" sermon series begins today by exploring "Why care about creation? Isn't God in control?" Next week, May 12, we'll consider "Are we saved?" On Sunday, May 19 we will wrestle with "How can we be church with differing political views?" * We will then take a break on Sunday, May 26 to welcome Father Elias Chacour to the pulpit at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Father Chacour is internationally known for his work for reconciliation between Palestinians and Jews. * Each Sunday we come together to worship at 8:00 (Communion), 9:30, and 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary and at 4:00 p.m. for a jazz Communion service here in Buchanan Chapel. * On Wednesday mornings we gather in the chapel for Morning Prayer, an opportunity to pray for all Fourth Church members by name throughout the year and for those in need.



Today is **Care of Creation Sunday**, a day when we hold in prayer God's amazing creation and recommit ourselves to the good stewardship of that life-giving gift. * This Sunday and May 19 we will be piloting the composting of materials from Coffee Hour and Sunday Night Supper. * Another opportunity to take part in "reusing" takes place on Saturday, May 11 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.: our annual **Bike Drive** to collect used bicycles and parts for repair and distribution to those in need of a means of transportation here in Chicago as well as in Africa and Latin America. * Also this Saturday, May 11 if you are looking for plant starts for your home garden or your planters, stop by the Chicago Lights Urban Farm (444 W. Chicago) between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. for their **plant sale.** * Men's Breakfast that morning will include a program on **Openlands**, which works to protect the natural and open spaces of northeastern Illinois and the surrounding region to ensure cleaner air and water, protect natural habitats and wildlife, and help balance and enrich our lives.



We believe in living out our **commitment to mission** by sharing in the struggles and hopes of our brothers and sisters both in this city and around the world, working together for a world of compassion, peace, and justice. As an expression of that commitment, travelers from Fourth Church will be spending this week with our sister congregation, the **First Presbyterian Church of Havana**, in Havana, Cuba. * We also have several upcoming opportunities to learn about ministries of compassion and justice. On Tuesday, May 14 at 8:00 a.m. at Catholic Charities (721 N. LaSalle), there will be an "On the Table" presentation about "**Better Health through Housing**," and on Tuesday, May 21 at 6:00 p.m. in the Bumpus Room, there will be a program on **inequities plaguing Chicago public schools.**



Sunday School children will join us in worship next Sunday, May 12 at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m., sitting with their parents until just prior to the sermon, when children leave with their teachers for their Gratz 4 classrooms. Next Sunday will also be the **last week of Sunday School.** * **Summer Sunday School** will begin on June 2 with just one session on each Sunday, at 9:30 a.m. If you're planning to join us for **Family Camp** (May 17–19) in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, be sure to sign up this week! * Registration is also open for **Vacation Bible School,** which this summer takes us to ancient Greece with the Apostle Paul the mornings of August 5–9.



In addition to our **daily devotions**, we offer several other resources for **meditation and reflection**. Each Tuesday, we begin the day with time set apart for **Sacred Pause** meditation, twenty minutes of silence in Stone Chapel at 7:45 a.m. * We then end the day with **Tuesday evening meditation**, hosted by our Replogle Center for Counseling and Well-Being, at 7:00 p.m. * Later this month, on Thursday, May 23 at 5:30 p.m., **Women at Fourth** will hold a program on contemplative prayer, and our monthly candlelit **Taizé service** will be held on Friday, May 24 at 7:30 p.m.



For those looking to enrich their faith, **Men's Bible study** gathers this Tuesday morning, May 7 in the Loop, as it does on the first and third Tuesday of each month. * This Wednesday noon, the **Horizon's Bible study** for women also has its monthly meeting. * Later in May, a three-month **Men's Faith Discussion group** will begin on Friday mornings. Those who are interested in joining this small group for study and sharing are asked to register in advance (see the sign-up page noted on page 11.)



Our other opportunities to learn together include the Replogle Center for Counseling and Well-Being's "Music, Nostalgia, and Wellness" program on Wednesday afternoon, which will invite those sixty and over to share the soundtrack of their lives (class size is limited; advance registration is required). * Then next Tuesday evening, May 14, Books by Women will discuss Paulette Jiles' News of the World.



Are you planning to run the Chicago Marathon this year? If so, we hope you will join the **Chicago Lights**Marathon Team in support of our nonprofit community outreach arm, Chicago Lights. * Another running—
and walking!—opportunity will take place on Saturday, June 1, when the Racial Equity Council will be raising funds for antiracism work through the **GospelRun**. Walkers and runners are needed as are donations in support of them.



Taking part in our walking and running teams is just one way to support the mission and ministry of Fourth Church. We are also in need of individuals to **serve as greeters** to welcome and assist worshipers during Sunday Jazz at Four services. * **Youth Ministry** is also recruiting an adult leadership team for the 2019–2020 program year, which begins in September.
