

Contemplating Sacred Space



The Great East Window in the Fourth Church sanctuary was designed and made by renowned stained glass artist Charles J. Connick of Boston and dedicated in 1930.

Also known as the Nettie Fowler McCormick Memorial Window, it illustrates the growth of Christianity from the four major prophets through the four evangelists, accompanied by the commanding figures of Peter and Paul.

Shown at left is the evangelist Saint Matthew, who stands in the leftmost opening of the window. (The identification "Saint Matthew" appears above his head.) The panel below him *(upper right on this page)* portrays the parable of the wedding attendants who did not know at what hour the bridegroom would come (Matthew 25:1–13). Below that is the prophet Isaiah, seated with scroll and staff.
