We are glad to have you with us today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Church! * Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. * We invite you to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice. Free Friday Noonday Concerts continue this autumn, with performances moving indoors starting this Friday with a concert by Kate Carter and Louise Chan in Buchanan Chapel. The concert schedule can be found on the Fourth Church website. "Get Connected" through fellowship, education, and service at Fourth Church! Next Sunday, September 8, all are invited to Anderson Hall and the Commons following morning worship for the annual "Get Connected" Coffee Hour, an opportunity to identify ways to connect through educational opportunities, fellowship groups, volunteer needs, and other activities. Various small groups offer additional ways to get connected at Fourth Church. These include Books by Women, which will discuss Pachinko by Min Jin Lee on Tuesday, September 10, and a new Men's Faith Discussion Group. This men's group, which will begin on Friday, September 20 at 7:00 a.m. in the Randolph Room, will bring together seven to ten men for conversation about the ways in which scripture intersects with their lives. Since space is limited, preregistration (see the sign-up page) is required. The September Cornerstones dinner this Friday, September 6 has reached capacity, but all are welcome to attend the program by John M. Buchanan that will follow in Buchanan Chapel. (Please arrive prior to 7:15 p.m.) On "Get Connected" Sunday, our children and youth will also kick off their fall programming. Their choirs resume rehearsals on Sunday, September 8 in Room 4F, with Cherub Choir (age three through first-graders) at 9:00 a.m., Youth Choir (sixth-graders through twelfth-graders) at 10:00 a.m., and Children's Choir (second-graders through fifth-graders) at 10:30 a.m. * Sunday School starts up again that day, with classes at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. * Eighth-grade Confirmation will begin at 11:00 a.m. (the registration deadline is today; see the sign-up page for details), and the Junior High (9:30 a.m.) and Senior High (11:00 a.m.) groups will also gather, with a joint time for weekly youth fellowship at 10:30 a.m.
