easter vigil

In keeping with the Jewish faith of Jesus, a new day begins at sunset rather than sunrise, and so tonight begins the celebration of Easter. We begin at 8:00 p.m. in darkness, symbolizing our separation from God and our yearning to be reunited with God. A new fire will be lit, symbolizing the hope of the Resurrection and the love of God.

To participate fully in the vigil take a moment to gather a candle and a way to light it; a cup of water; a bell, drum, or noisemaker (this could be as simple as keys on a keyring); and elements for communion such as crackers or bread and juice.

Leader: This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers.

This is the night when first you saved our forebears: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when the pillar of fire destroyed the darkness of sin! This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean from sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness. This is the night when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

All: Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Jesus Christ our King is risen!

Leader: Lord God, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son. Most blessed of nights, chosen by God to see Christ rising from the dead! The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy; it casts out hatred, brings us peace, and humbles earthly pride. Night truly blessed, when heaven is wedded to earth and we are reconciled with God! Therefore, gracious God, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your church's solemn offering. May this Easter candle always dispel the darkness of this night! May the morning star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that morning star, who came back from the dead and shed his peaceful light on all creation, your Son, who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.
