An Invitation to Observe a Holy Lent

Psalter
Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love;

People: have mercy on us, O God.

- Leader: For our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,
- People: have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: Accept our repentance, O God, for the wrongs we have done. For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

People: have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,
People: have mercy on us, O God.
Leader: For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us,
People: have mercy on us, O God.
Leader: <i>Restore us</i> , O God of our salvation, and show us your steadfast love. People: Turn to us in your mercy and redeem us.
