sing praise to God, the Three-in-One:



These will be a 10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary and 4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel. Because there will be limited seating for both services (250 in the Sanctuary)—as well as self-certification requirements those who would like to worship in person will be asked to preregister online. We are currently working on setting up the registration system, and as soon as it is open for use, we will send details to those on our News @ Fourth Church email list (subscribe at www.bit.ly/newsfromfpc if you do not already receive it weekly) as well as post an easily accessible link on the website. Masks will be required at all times for all present in the building, and social distancing will also be required. - We will continue to **stream worship** for those who prefer to worship online or are unable to join us in person.
