

We will be offering two in-person worship services each Sunday, beginning Sunday, June 20 as we gradually reopen our campus this summer. These will be a 10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary and 4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel. Because there will be limited seating for both services (250 in the morning in the Sanctuary; 65 in the afternoon in the Chapel)—as well as self-certification requirements—those who would like to worship in person will be asked to preregister online.

We are currently working on setting up the registration system; as soon as it is open for use, we will send details to those on our News @ Fourth Church email list (subscribe at www. bit.ly/newsfromfpc if you do not already receive it weekly). We will also post an easily accessible link on the website.

A limited number of seats will be available for on-site registration for visitors and those without a way to access technology. Those individuals will need to register at the door—a process that will include recording name and contact information as well as completing the necessary self-certification—so anyone who can preregister online will find that to be the fastest and easiest way to reserve a seat.

Masks will be required at all times for all present in the building, and social distancing will also be required. You can read more about the guidelines in place for in-person worship as well as information about continued online opportunities at www.fourthchurch.org/reopening
