The remainder of the Sanctuary is open seating, with masks optional. Seating for Jazz at Four is set up for social distancing. ** Due to health guidelines, **congregational singing is not permitted in the Sanctuary or Chapel;** those who would like to hum while the choir members sing the hymns are invited to do so.

TODAY'S POSTLUDE was written by Godwin Sadoh. Born in Lagos, Nigeria, in 1965, Sadoh is the first African to receive a doctoral degree in organ performance. He first heard a pipe organ at a church in Lagos and writes, "At the end of each service on Sundays, I always ran as quickly as I could to observe the organist play the postlude. It was heavenly for me. I would watch the feet of the organist as they move on the pedals and saw the pulling out of the stops and change of sound." His music brings the melodies, harmonies, and rhythms of the music of Yoruban people to the organ.
