Morrow, Associate Pastor for Evangelism and Community Engagement; Natalie Moore, WBEZ journalist and author of *The South Side: A Portrait of Chicago and American Segregation;* David Daniels III, Professor of Church History, McCormick Theological Seminary; and Bradford Hunt, History Department Chair, Loyola Univeristy.

THE AFRICAN AMERICAN SPIRITUAL "DEEP RIVER," heard in this morning's prelude, is a well-loved and well-known spiritual that was sung by enslaved people in the South long before the American Civil War. It was first printed in 1867 and sung by the Fisk University Jubilee Singers as they toured American and Europe. It was later sung in 1939 by Marian Anderson on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.
