We are glad to have you with us today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Presbyterian Church! * Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. * We invite you to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice.

On the Fourth Church campus, including in worship, everyone is required to wear masks, fully covering the nose and mouth. Anyone not wearing a mask fully covering their nose and mouth will be asked to leave, as we know that some people make the decision to worship with us in person—or participate in other in-person activities—based on the knowledge that everyone will be fully masked. This is but one of the ways we continue to live out our commitment to value the health and safety of all. * For those worshiping with us in person, we are not checking vaccination status, but by entering the Fourth Church campus you certify that (a) you do not currently have COVID-19; (b) you are not experiencing COVID symptoms; (c) you have no reason to quarantine; and (d) you will practice social distancing if you are not vaccinated against COVID-19. * In Friday's weekly News @ Fourth Church email newsletter (see the box below to subscribe), we shared the following note in light of the City of Chicago lifting its mask mandate in most settings: As Shannon Kershner wrote in her congregational email last week, "until you hear otherwise, please assume that we will keep doing what we are doing now—masks required, restricted campus access and hours, etc. I thank you for your patience." The wide range of programs, activities, and participants that are part of our Fourth Church and Chicago Lights community make how we move forward around masking complex, particularly given the number of vulnerable populations we serve—from preschoolers to older adults to those with insufficient access to health care—and given the range of staff and volunteers who work with them. So while we will not be lifting our mask mandate on February 28, please know that we are hard at work determining what our life together will look like around masks, in-person programs, and more!

If you would like to join us for **in-person worship**, we gather each Sunday for a **10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary** and a **4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel. * Worshipers are invited to sing while masked.** We invite those who are concerned about being near those who are singing to worship with us from home via our 10:00 a.m. livestream, which is also available for viewing later in the week. *** Worship in the Chapel can be heard** through hearing aids' "T" or "T-coil" setting. *** Please** silence electronic devices when in the Chapel. ***** The **doors open for worship** on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. For the 4:00 service, access is only by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center. *** Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (*access from Rush or Walton*) at the rate of \$9 between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garage must be picked up from an usher. *** For those who prefer to worship online** or are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning worship service at 10:00 a.m. on our YouTube channel (*www.bit.ly/fpcvideos*). (*The prelude begins at approximately 9:45 a.m.*)

This Wednesday, March 2 is Ash Wednesday. In observance of this solemn day, Ash Wednesday services will be held at 12:10 p.m. (Shannon Kershner preaching) and 7:30 p.m. (Rocky Supinger preaching). Both services will include Communion and the imposition of ashes. The 7:30 p.m. service will also be livestreamed on our YouTube channel (*www.bit.ly/fpcvideos*). * We will also be offering "Ashes on the Way" on Wednesday. Pastors and members will be present outside the Sanctuary between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. They will be available to impose ashes for those in our community who are unable to be with us for worship but who find the ashes a meaningful way to mark the beginning of this season of repentance and reflection.

As we look ahead to Lent, we invite you to use our **Lenten devotions as a resource for meditation and** reflection during the season. To receive those meditations daily via email beginning on Ash Wednesday, simply subscribe at www.bit.ly/fpcdevotions (*if you already receive our daily devotions, you will be sent the Lenten ones automatically*). * Also available for your reflection during the season will be a **Lenten "Rhythm** and Word" video series. These brief worship experiences, which weave together scripture, prayer, and music, will be released on our YouTube channel (*www.bit.ly/fpcvideos*) on Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m. To receive them by email, sign up online at www.bit.ly/rhythmandwordemail * **Zoom Small Groups for Lent** will start the week of February 27.
