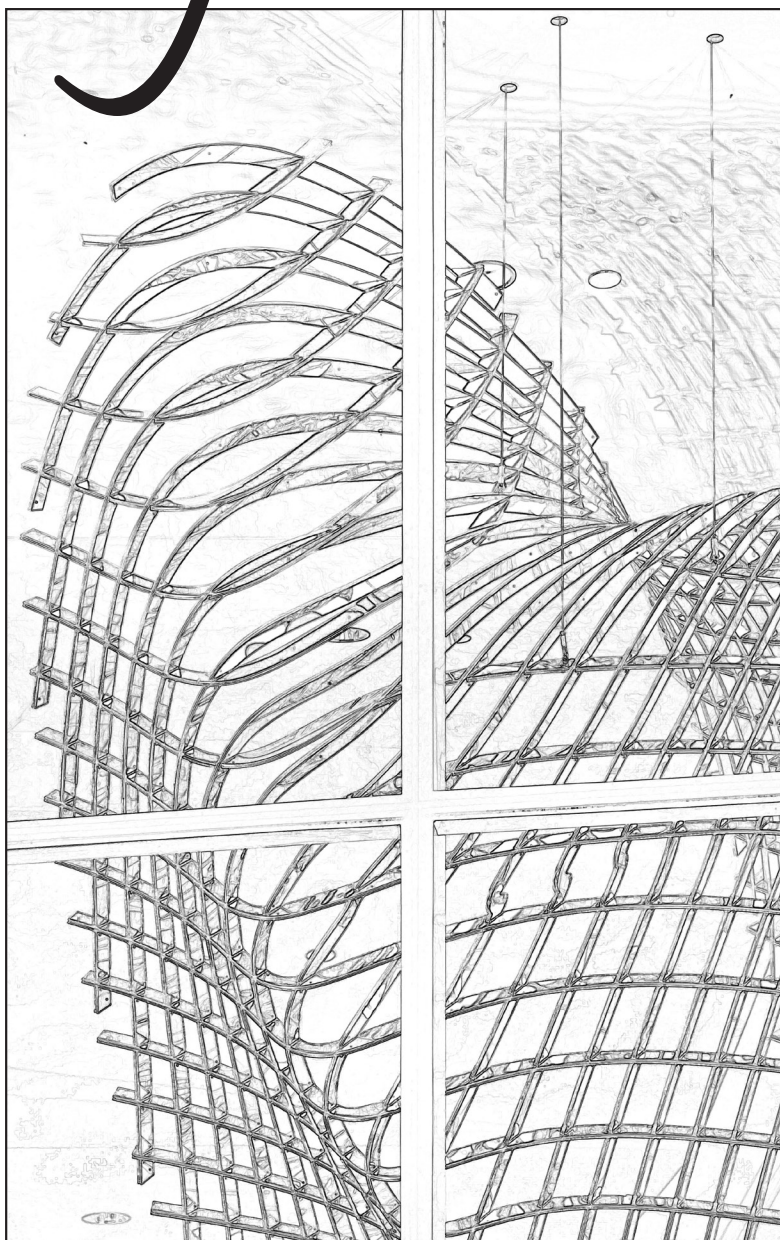

News and Opportunities

We are glad to have you with us today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Presbyterian Church! * **Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ**, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. * **We invite you to join us** at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice. * Although wearing a mask is not required at Fourth Church, we as a community have made a commitment to be a **mask-welcoming campus**, encouraging the wearing of masks by anyone who wants or needs to wear one. As a mask-welcoming campus, we also remain committed to **ensuring no one will feel out of place should they choose to wear a mask while at Fourth Church**.



If you would like to join us for **in-person worship**, we gather on Sundays for a **10:00 a.m. service** in the Sanctuary and the **4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service** in Buchanan Chapel. Please note, however, that we **will not be gathering for Jazz at Four on Christmas Day or New Year's Day**; our 4:00 p.m. Sunday jazz services will resume on Sunday, January 8. * Worship can be heard through **hearing aids' "T" or "T-coil" setting**. * **Please** silence electronic devices when in the Chapel. * The **doors open for worship** on Sundays a half hour before each service. For the 4:00 service, access is only by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center. * **Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (*access from Rush or Walton*) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (*and \$18 for up to 12 hours*). Validation tickets for the garage must be picked up from an usher. * **For those who prefer to worship online** or are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning service on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos).



On Wednesdays we gather for **Morning Prayer via Zoom** at 9:30 a.m. and for **in-person Morning Prayer** at 10:00 a.m. in Buchanan Chapel (*although we will not gather in person on Wednesday, December 28*). Email Nancy Benson-Nicol (nbenson-nicol@fourthchurch.org) for Zoom information. * **To submit a prayer request** to our Morning Prayer or Deacon Prayer Ministries, please email caringministries@fourthchurch.org. * The chapel is also open for opportunity to **walk the labyrinth** between 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays (*except Tuesday, December 27*). For labyrinth details, email Rocky Supinger (rsupinger@fourthchurch.org).

For those experiencing grief, sadness, and loneliness in this season, the **“Longest Night” service**, will be held this Wednesday, December 21 at 6:30 p.m. in Buchanan Chapel. There will also be opportunity that evening to **walk the labyrinth** in Anderson Hall between 5:30 and 6:30 p.m. * Our weekly **Advent “Rhythm and Word” video series** serves as a resource for prayer and reflection. A new video is released each Wednesday evening on YouTube (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos); subscribe at www.bit.ly/rhythmandwordemail to receive them by email. * **Daily Advent and Christmas devotions** offer another resource for **personal meditation and prayer**. Sign up at www.bit.ly/fpcdevotions to receive them in your inbox.



On Saturday, December 24 we will gather for **four Candlelight Christmas Eve services**: Children’s Pageant (4:00 p.m.), Family Service (6:00 p.m.), and Service of Lessons and Carols (8:00 and 10:00 p.m.; the 8:00 p.m. service will be livestreamed at www.bit.ly/fpcvideos). * On Christmas Eve, **all entry to the Sanctuary for worship will be through the glass Loggia doors** on Michigan Avenue. * **Seating will begin** at 3:15 p.m. for the Pageant; seating for the other three services will begin a half hour prior to the start of the service. * There **will not be any socially distanced seating** on Christmas Eve; the regular Sunday morning socially distanced section will be available on Christmas morning. * **Nursery care will not be available** on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, or New Year’s Day. On those days, children are invited to worship with their parents, as they are on every Sunday. * **Discounted parking** on Christmas Eve is available only at the 900 N. Michigan garage. Those who enter the garage on Christmas Eve *prior* to 5:00 p.m. will need to purchase a parking validation ticket at the church that day for \$20. Those who enter the garage *after* 5:00 p.m. will be able to park for \$8 with a validation ticket that can be picked up for free that day at the church.



On Sunday, December 25, **Christmas Day**, we will gather for one service only, at 10:00 a.m. (*in person and livestreamed*). There will be **no Jazz at Four service on Sundays, December 25 and January 1**. After that two-week break, Jazz at Four will resume on Sunday, January 8.



Our **New Year’s Eve Taizé service** will take place on Saturday, December 31 at 7:30 p.m. in Buchanan Chapel. This quiet candlelit service offers moving music, space for prayer, and meditative pause for reflecting on the year past and looking ahead to the year to come.



Are you interested in taking part in **Deep Listening Dinners** in early 2023? Groups of six to ten people each will dine together twice in home settings, gathering for a time of discovering and better understanding our differences while honoring our shared humanity and telling our life experiences to one another.
