If you would like to join us for in-person worship, we gather on Sundays for a 10:00 a.m. service in the Sanctuary and the 4:00 p.m. Jazz at Four service in Buchanan Chapel. * Worship can be heard through hearing aids' "T" or "T-coil" setting. * Please silence electronic devices when in the Chapel. * The doors open for worship on Sundays a half hour before each service. For the 4:00 service, access is only by the Delaware doors to the Gratz Center. * Sunday parking is available at 900 N. Michigan (access from Rush or Walton) at the rate of \$9 for 6 hours between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (and \$18 for up to 12 hours). Validation tickets for the garage must be picked up from an usher. * For those who prefer to worship online or are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning service on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos).



In late May our worship at 4:00 p.m. will enter a summer sabbatical season of rest and refocusing for the future. We will worship together through Sunday, May 21, and then, beginning Memorial Day weekend, we will not worship at 4:00 p.m. during the summer. The meeting will be both in person in the Sanctuary and livestreamed. Afterwards we will gather in Anderson Hall and the Commons for a festive **reception honoring Shannon**. We invite you to join us for this time of expressing gratitude and well wishes to her and her family as they prepare for the move to Atlanta.

On Wednesday, the Personnel Council emailed the congregation to share that Session has approved the recommendation to hire an intentional Interim Pastor, with a contract for one year maximum that is renewable. The Interim Pastor will not be our next Senior Pastor. Rather they will be someone to guide us during the year or more when we are searching for the next Pastor. That Interim Pastor will help us do the kind of preparatory work that is important in advance of welcoming a new leader. The first step in this intentional interim process will be to identify possible candidates for the Interim Pastor position. This will be the work of an Interim Pastor Nominating Committee (IPNC) made up of three members of the Personnel Council and two members selected by Session, who will work with Craig Howard, Executive Presbyter for the Chicago Presbytery. * If you did not receive the email announcement from the Personnel Council, subscribe to the Fourth Church email newsletter to ensure you see future updates about the process of hiring an Interim Pastor.
