News and Opportunities

We are glad to be worshiping with you today and hope you will explore the many opportunities for learning, serving, and community building at Fourth Church!

** Inspired by the radical hospitality of Jesus Christ, we welcome everyone, without exception, into the life of this congregation. ** We invite you to join us at this intersection of faith and life as we share God's grace with one another and the world through worship and ministries of healing, reconciliation, and justice.



For those who prefer to worship online or who are unable to join us in person, we livestream our morning service at 10:00 a.m. on our YouTube channel (www.bit.ly/fpcvideos), where the service is also available for viewing afterwards. **** Those without Internet access** are invited to listen via phone by calling 888.916.9166 at the time of the livestreamed service.



If you would like to join us for **in-person worship**, we gather each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. **On Sundays the **doors open for worship** a half hour prior to the service. There are three fully accessible entrances, without steps, that lead to the Sanctuary: on Michigan Avenue (through the glass Loggia doors located between the courtyard and the main Sanctuary doors); at 126 E. Chestnut; and at 115 E. Delaware. ** **Sunday parking** is available at 900 N. Michigan (access from Rush or Walton) at the rate of \$9 for hours between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (and \$18 for up to 12 hours) and at the Hancock garage (875 N. Michigan, enter from Delaware or Chestnut) at the rate of \$10 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from an usher. **In the Sanctuary worship can be heard through the "T" or "T-coil" setting of hearing aids. ** Please silence **electronic devices** during worship.



Children are always welcome in worship! If you need to step out to comfort your child, the Hospitality Suite, on the second floor of the Gratz Center, is a quiet space for families where worship is livestreamed. During the morning service nursery care for infants through two-year-olds is available on the fourth floor of the Gratz Center. ** Sunday School does not meet in August; we look forward to it resuming on Sunday, September 10.

We ask all who are worshiping with us to let us know you are here by filling out an information form.

Those worshiping with us via livestream will find a link to the online form—which takes only 20 seconds to complete!—included in the descriptive text below the video (after exiting full-screen view); a QR code is also displayed during the "Welcome and Announcements" that can be scanned with a phone camera to take you to the form. Those worshiping with us in person are asked to use the information pads in the pews, passing them down the pew so worshipers have opportunity to greet one another by name following the service. ** Following the service, those worshiping in person are also invited to greet one another during Coffee Hour, which during the summer is held outdoors if weather and air conditions permit or in Anderson Hall and the Commons.

Two new 10-foot-long banners hang on the pillars in the back of the Sanctuary. Representing Illinois prairie grasses and sky, they are **part of the Ordinary Time banner collection commissioned** in 2021 for our 150th anniversary. Designed by Ellie Cotey, with additional sewing done by members of the Benevolent Guild, the collection **evokes this congregation's call to be a light in the city.** The pulpit parament, which **incorporates a map of Chicago,** is created from 150 pieces, one for each year of our sesquicentennial history. In it, the rays of light radiate from the church location and spread throughout Chicago's neighborhoods, representing an impact that stretches beyond the borders of our great city. The bright colors are **inspired by and celebrate Chicago's native landscape:** the blue of Lake Michigan and the green of prairie grasses encompass a city composed of both the colors of six native wildflowers and the colors present in Fourth Church's logo. The banners hanging from the balconies offer images of those local wildflowers.



The **scaffolding** on the exterior of the Fourth Church campus is to enable tuckpointing, flashing, and window repair being done this summer. The scaffolding in the North Balcony of the Sanctuary is to assist in addressing the gradual delamination of a few of the Bartlett murals on the ceiling.

THE FIRST PRELUDE PIECE, "In Quiet Mood," was composed by Florence B. Price. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, she earned degrees in organ and piano from the New England Conservatory of Music before moving to Chicago in 1927. While in Chicago she studied with Leo Sowerby, who had been Associate Organist at Fourth Church. Florence Price became the first African American woman to have her music played by a major orchestra when in 1933 the Chicago Symphony Orchestra presented her *Symphony in E Minor*, one of her more than 300 compositions.
