This year's Paul Galloway Lecture will take place on Saturday, July 19 at 10:00 a.m. in Buchanan Chapel and via Zoom. To attend, register at bit.ly/galloway25

The 2025 speaker, the Reverend Jermaine Ross-Allam—a Presbyterian minister, social ethicist, and scholar—will talk about "Repair of Historical Harms," as we further the understanding of the Christian church's role in creating and perpetuating transgenerational injustice.

Acknowledging complicity and responsibility in past actions and inactions and the harm caused to Indigenous peoples, African Americans, and other marginalized groups in the United States, we pave the way for repair—for healing, reconciliation, and positive change in us and in our communities.

#### Art Exhibition in the Loggia

The summer art exhibition in our Loggia Gallery features works by Charlene Moy, a Chicago-based Chinese American artist who assembles and weaves artificial materials with artist media to draw attention to the impact plastics have on our environment.

### About the Sanctuary Banners

"Ordinary Time" is the name given to the longest liturgical season of the church year, the period between the Day of Pentecost (June 8 this year) and the start of Advent (November 30 this year). The banners hanging in the Sanctuary during Ordinary Time were commissioned for our 150th anniversary (2021) and evoke this congregation's call to be a light in the city.

The pulpit parament, which incorporates a map of Chicago, is created from 150 pieces, one for each year of our sesquicentennial history. In it, the rays of light radiate from the church location and spread throughout Chicago's neighborhoods, representing an impact that stretches beyond the borders of our great city. The bright colors are inspired by and celebrate Chicago's native landscape: the blue of Lake Michigan and the green of prairie grasses encompass a city composed of both the colors of six native wildflowers and the colors present in Fourth Church's logo.

The six banners hanging from the side balconies offer images of those local wildflowers.

The banners and paraments were designed and created by Fourth Church member Ellie Cotey, Costume Manager and Head of Wardrobe for the Joffrey Ballet. Members of the Benevolent Guild, the longest-running group at Fourth Church, assisted with the sewing.

TODAY WE CELEBRATE THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER. The invitation to the table is not just for Presbyterians or "members of the church." Even those who doubt or whose trust is wavering are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper, in which we are assured of God's love and grace. Those who are worshiping with us from home are encouraged to have bread and juice on hand so that we might share in this meal together, wherever we are

THE AUTHOR OF THE WORDS TO THE CLOSING HYMN, Katharine Lee Bates, stopped in Chicago in 1893 to visit the Columbian Exposition World's Fair on her way from Massachusetts to a summer teaching job in Colorado Springs. A breathtaking trip she made to the top of Colorado's Pikes Peak inspired the hymn's reference to "purple mountain majesties," but it was her recollection of the shining classical buildings of the Chicago exposition—the first world's fair to be powered entirely by electricity—that is reflected in the line "thine alabaster cities gleam."
