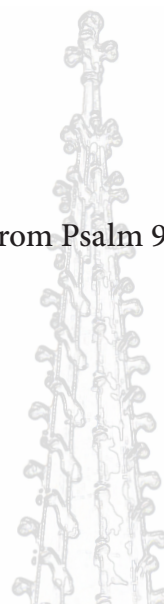

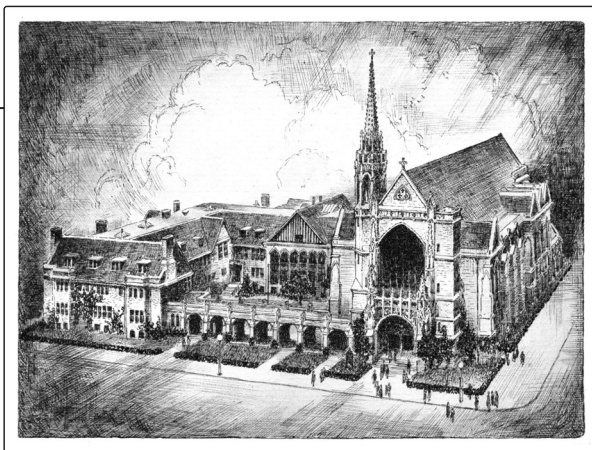

One of the earliest religious poems in the Italian language, it is made even more expansive by the broad, repetitive melody of the hymn tune ‘Lasst Uns Erfreuen’ (‘Let Us Rejoice’) with interspersed ‘Alleluias.’”
