

The Sacrament of Baptism

Fourth Church includes the Sacrament of Baptism in worship on the second Sunday of the month. Baptism is the sign and seal of God's grace and covenant in Christ. As The Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (USA) explains, baptism signifies the faithfulness of God, the washing away of sin, rebirth, putting on the fresh garment of Christ, and adoption into the covenant family of the church.

When we baptize infants, we witness to the truth that God's love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. The congregation, on behalf of the whole church, assumes responsibility for nurturing the baptized children in the Christian life, and it is for this reason that the congregation makes such a promise during the service.


As we celebrate the baptism of these children, we also remember that we too were baptized and as children of God are part of the worldwide family of faith.

A Note from the Board of Trustees

At the Annual Congregational Meeting today, February 8, members will receive Fourth Church's 2025 financial results. Presented by the Treasurer, the report was prepared on behalf of the Board of Trustees and reflects the collaborative work of church staff and volunteer leaders.

The Board of Trustees serves as the congregation's legal and corporate representative and, along with the Session, provides fiduciary oversight of finances, operations, property, and legal matters in support of the church's mission. This work is supported by staff and volunteer leaders and is designed to promote thoughtful planning and accountability.

With an annual budget of nearly \$12 million, day-to-day financial operations are led by the Executive Director of Operational Ministries and the accounting team. They are supported by a nationally recognized nonprofit accounting firm for financial reporting. Trustees meet regularly to review results and provide oversight.

We are grateful for the many volunteers who serve behind the scenes and welcome members with relevant skills who feel called to participate in this important ministry.
