At Fourth Church, our Board of Trustees is committed to ensuring our financial resources sustain the vibrant programs that serve our community. This month, we highlight our support for Chicago Lights, the nonprofit community outreach and social services organization affiliated with Fourth Presbyterian Church—a cornerstone of our Long-Range Plan and a vital expression of our faith.

Chicago Lights is a separate 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with its own Chicago Lights Board of Directors. In 2026, Chicago Lights is investing more than \$2.9 million into Tutoring, Summer Day, the Urban Farm, and the Social Service Center programs, supporting youth development and adult social services across Chicago.

This funding supports the staff, transportation, equipment, and resources that make these programs possible, helping youth and adults build skills, overcome systemic barriers, and lead fulfilling lives. Chicago Lights programs are further strengthened through shared support from Fourth Church, including leadership, operations, facilities, and community engagement.

These ministries are made possible through your generosity to Chicago Lights directly — especially annual pledges and charitable contributions — with support funded through individual giving (40%), foundations (31%), events (25%), and program fees and other income sources (4%).

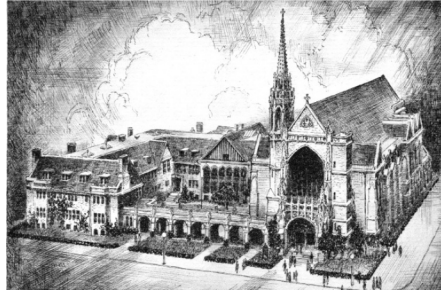
## YOU BELONG HERE

## The Music Today

Ross Updegraff, guest organist

Summer Choir

Contemporary African American composer Adolphus Hailstork was born in 1941 and taught music composition at universities. His spiritual arrangement, *Everytime I Feel the Spirit*, is ebullient and includes interesting use of rhythm and time signature shifts. Maurice Duruflé's *Prélude, adagio et choral varié sur le theme du 'Veni Creator'* concludes with the ancient chant melody *Veni Creator Spiritus, Come Holy Spirit*, as a theme and four variations. During today's prelude, we intersperse the theme and three variations with our choir singing the hymn in English. The final variation will be played as today's postlude.
