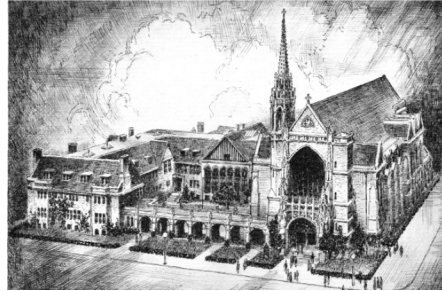
## YOU BELONG HERE
