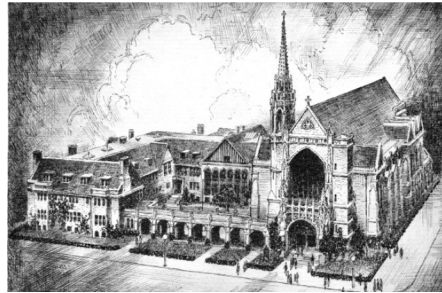
## YOU BELONG HERE

**HONORING JUNETEENTH**

The Fourth Church Racial Equity Committee invites the congregation to join in commemorating Juneteenth, the holiday marking the emancipation of enslaved Black Americans.
