Michael Rees has been the organ scholar of Fourth Church since September 2021. A native of rural southeastern Colorado, he began taking organ lessons at Pomona College in Claremont, California while earning his degree in mathematics from neighboring Harvey Mudd College. Michael is currently studying with Stephen Buzard, director of music at Chicago's St. James Cathedral; previously, his major teachers have included Dr. William Peterson and Daryl Robinson.

Michael is a frequent recitalist in the Chicago area, with upcoming and recent appearances at First Presbyterian Church of Arlington Heights, the Lutheran School of Theology, St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Evanston, St. James Cathedral in Chicago, and Madonna della Strada Chapel at Loyola University, in addition to his regular appearances on the Fourth Church Friday noonday series. In October 2022, he played a dedication recital of the renovated organ of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Greeley, Colorado. Although he is comfortable playing in a wide variety of styles, he has a particularly deep love of the twentieth-century English repertoire.

Michael is currently serving as the secretary of the Chicago chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Before coming to Fourth Church, he held organist positions at Barrington United (continued on reverse)

Methodist Church and at the First Presbyterian Church of Sugar Land, Texas. He is also an avid open-source software programmer and has contributed to many widely used projects. He has a deep love of typography as an art form and is currently working on Burro, a modern language for digital typesetting.
