We are halfway to our goal! Thanks to all the faithful members and friends who have already made contributions to Fourth Church's Capital Campaign, "A Light in the City: Sharing God's Grace." We have currently received 635 pledges totaling more than \$15 million toward our goal of \$30 million. In addition, we have received 687 pledges totaling more than \$1.7 million toward our annual Stewardship goal of \$2.6 million. Fourth Church is a church of 4,800 households, so we are counting on many more responses to the invitation to make a pledge to the campaign and the annual fund.
