This year's Easter Vigil will begin at 8:00 p.m. in the Garth with the kindling of a fire to provide candlelight to carry into the darkened Sanctuary. Once inside there will be readings from scripture that cover the entire salvation story, from creation through redemption, and the service will conclude with a reaffirmation of baptismal vows and the celebration of Communion.

On Maundy Thursday, there will be a 12:10 p.m. Communion service as well as a 7:30 p.m. Tenebrae service, also with Communion. The Tenebrae service portrays the progression from light to darkness in the passion of Jesus. At the conclusion of the service, the Sanctuary will be in darkness.

On Good Friday, there will be a 12:10 p.m. service and, at 7:30 p.m., a choral service, featuring the works of Allegri, Casals, and Poulenc. At 4:00 p.m. there will also be a service in Buchanan Chapel for children.
