Today we dedicate during the 11:00 a.m. service the Buchanan Chapel sculpture installed in memory of Dana Ferguson, who served Fourth Church as Executive Associate Pastor until the time of her death in 2008. Following the 11:00 service, all are invited to the chapel to see this beautiful artwork and to greet Dana's family.

Shannon Kershner's first Sunday in the Fourth Church pulpit will be May 18, when she will preach at all four services. She will then return to North Carolina to help her family with the move to Chicago. Shannon will next preach here on Sunday, June 15 and will preach each Sunday the remainder of June and July, after which she will travel, as part of prior commitments, on Sundays, August 3, 10, and 17, before returning to Fourth Church August 24. She will be formally installed as Pastor on Sunday, September 21 during a festive 11:00 worship service, after which we will host a special reception to celebrate and officially welcome Shannon, Greg, Hannah, and Ryan.
