Michigan, enter from Delaware or Chestnut) at the rate of \$10 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Validation tickets for the garages must be picked up from an usher. **Nursery care* is not available at this time. **Worship can be heard in the Sanctuary and Chapel through the "T" or "T-coil" setting of hearing aids. **Please silence electronic devices when in the Sanctuary or Chapel.

The Ordinary Time banners hanging in the Sanctuary today were commissioned for our 150th anniversary and evoke this congregation's call to be a light in the city. The pulpit parament, which incorporates a map of Chicago, is created from 150 pieces, one for each year of our history. In it, the rays of light radiate from the church location and spread throughout Chicago's neighborhoods, representing an impact that stretches beyond the borders of our great city. The bright colors are inspired by and celebrate Chicago's native landscape: the blue of Lake Michigan and the green of prairie grasses encompass a city composed of both the colors of six native wildflowers and the colors present in Fourth Church's logo. The hanging banners offer images of those local wildflowers.

This year Ash Wednesday is on March 2. That day **Ash Wednesday services** will be held at 12:10 p.m. (Shannon Kershner preaching) and 7:30 p.m. (Rocky Supinger preaching). Both services will include Communion and the imposition of ashes. The **7:30 p.m. service will also be livestreamed** on our YouTube channel. ****** As part of **"Ashes on the Way,"** pastors will be present outside the Sanctuary between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. They will be available to impose ashes for those in our community who are unable to be with us for worship but who find the ashes a meaningful way to mark the beginning of this season of repentance and reflection.
